

Jamison, handpicked by Ailey to lead the company after his death in 1989, is heading up the search for her successor. "I have held this company in trust for Alvin Ailey, always feeling that he had placed in my

hands not a mere company but a living, breathing spirit," she says. "It is now time for me to pass on the great gift that I have held, making sure that the next hands to receive it are strong and capable."

- Postmodern dance pioneer Trisha Brown gave her final performance in February during her company's run at The Joyce Theater in New York City. Brown, 71, said she was retiring from the stage to focus on other aspects of her career. A founding member of the Judson Dance Theater in the 1960s, Brown created her own company in 1970. Her innovative choreography has earned her numerous honors, among them the distinction of being the first female choreographer to receive the MacArthur Foundation Fellowship.
