After a landmark summer of performances in Paris and South Africa – an historic return to the country after nearly 20 years – the grace and bravura of the Company will reach the hearts and minds of audiences throughout the U.S. via the screen, the stage, and the page.

#### NATIONAL FILM DEBUT – "LINCOLN CENTER AT THE MOVIES: GREAT AMERICAN DANCE" ON OCTOBER 22

On **Thursday, October 22 at 7pm**, audiences across the nation will be able to enjoy Ailey's big screen debut, as part of <u>"Lincoln Center at the Movies: Great American Dance."</u> The film will be presented by Fathom Events and Lincoln Center, and shown on approximately 600 screens across the country. Captured before a live audience during Ailey's recent Lincoln Center season, the film includes audience favorites <u>Chroma</u> by Wayne McGregor, <u>Grace</u> by Ronald K. Brown, <u>Takademe</u> by Robert Battle, and of course, Alvin Ailey's American masterpiece <u>Revelations</u>, a must-see for all. The film is directed for the screen by Matthew Diamond and features a rare look behind the scenes and exclusive interviews with the artists. ### ROBERT BATTLE'S INSPIRING CHILDREN'S BOOK MY STORY, MY DANCE RELEASED OCTOBER 27

On October 27, the children's book <u>MY STORY, MY DANCE: Robert Battle's Journey to Alvin Ailey</u> will be released by Paula Wiseman Books, a division of Simon & Schuster Children's Publishing. Based on Battle's life, it is the unique story of a young boy who, despite physical challenges and personal hardships, has a life filled with music, church, and movement – first martial arts, and then, after seeing Alvin Ailey's Revelations, dance. Award-winning husband-and-wife team James Ransome and Lesa Cline-Ransome created the vibrant illustrations and wrote the inspiring narrative. The book is for ages 5 – 10, and is a success story that is sure to inspire all. # LANDMARK SEASON AT NEW YORK CITY CENTER DECEMBER 2 – JANUARY 3 & 20-CITY NORTH AMERICAN TOUR FEBRUARY 2 – MAY 8

Ailey closes 2015 with its 45<sup>th</sup> consecutive season at **New York City Center** from **December 2, 2015** – **January 3, 2016.** The Company's renowned artists will bring to life an expansive repertory of two dozen works by some of America's most celebrated dance-makers during this annual season, which has become a joyous holiday tradition. The performances will feature world premieres by **Kyle Abraham, Ronald K. Brown** and **Robert Battle** – his first since becoming Artistic Director – a Company premiere by **Paul Taylor**, and three new productions of Ailey Classics: *Cry, Love Songs*, and *Blues Suite*. The season will also include an **Opening Night Gala Benefit** honoring **BNY Mellon** and featuring **Scarlett Johansson** as Honorary Chair, the **Saturday Family Matinee Series**, a special **New Year's Eve 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary Tribute to Judith Jamison**, and much more. The season continues in 2016 with a **20-city North American tour** from **February 2 – May 8** launched by a gala at the **John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington D.C.** on **Tuesday, February 2.** Audiences from coast to coast will have the opportunity to see Ailey's extraordinary dancers live in world premieres, new productions, and Ailey classics.



#### **ABOUT ALVIN AILEY AMERICAN DANCE THEATER**

Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, recognized by U.S. Congressional resolution as a vital American "Cultural Ambassador to the World," grew from a now-fabled March 1958 performance in New York that forever changed the perception of American dance. Founded by Alvin Ailey, a recent posthumous recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom – the nation's highest civilian honor, and guided by Judith Jamison beginning in 1989, the Company is now led by Robert Battle, whom Judith Jamison chose to succeed her on July 1, 2011. Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater has performed for an estimated 25 million people in 71 countries on 6 continents, promoting the uniqueness of the

African-American cultural experience and the preservation and enrichment of the American modern dance tradition. In addition to being the Principal Dance Company of New York City Center, where its performances have become a year-end tradition, the Ailey company performs annually at Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts, the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, DC, the Auditorium Theatre in Chicago, the Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts of Miami-Dade County in Miami, The Fox Theatre in Atlanta, Zellerbach Hall in Berkeley, CA and at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center in Newark (where it is the Principal Resident Affiliate). The Company also appears frequently in other major theaters throughout the United States and the world during extensive annual tours. The Ailey organization also includes Ailey II (1974), a second performing company of emerging young dancers and innovative choreographers; The Ailey School (1969), one of the most extensive dance training programs in the world, Ailey Arts in Education & Community Programs, which brings dance into the classrooms, communities and lives of people of all ages, and The Ailey Extension (2005), a program offering dance and fitness classes to the general public, which began with the opening of Ailey's permanent home—the largest building dedicated to dance in New York City, the dance capital of the world —named The Joan Weill Center for Dance, at 55th Street at 9th Avenue in New York City.
