In addition to the exciting premieres, the inspiring finale of each program will be Alvin Ailey's perennial crowd-pleasing masterpiece <u>Revelations</u>, known to send hearts soaring and lift audiences to their feet. Ailey's 32 extraordinary dancers will delight and captivate audiences with a range of dynamic premieres and repertory favorites. The full program will be announced by January 2017.

Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater inspires in all a universal celebration of the human spirit using the African-American cultural experience and the American modern dance tradition. Nearly 60 years after its founding, Ailey continues to move forward under the leadership of Robert Battle, revealing once again why Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater is one of the world's most beloved dance companies.

## AILEY LAUNCHES PILOT "DESTINATION DANCE" PROGRAM IN ATLANTA

A long-beloved member of the Atlanta community with a 41-year history in the city, Ailey recently announced it will extend its position as a cultural ambassador by piloting the "Destination Dance" initiative, which will focus on collaborations with arts and civic organizations across the country to use dance as a centerpiece for engagement. Building upon existing and newly developed partnerships with several cultural institutions in the city, diverse year-round programming will be offered, ranging from performances to dance classes to educational programs for students.

Long-time partner and presenter of AileyCamp in Atlanta the Atlanta Ballet will host a joint training intensive for Georgia-area dancers offered with The Ailey School, in addition to annual auditions. The Ailey Extension's "Ailey Experience" workshops, open to the general public, will be scheduled at AREA dance studio. There is the potential for public and school-time performances by Ailey II at Rialto Center for the Arts at Georgia State University, as well as additional outreach and participation in ELEVATE, the multi-arts festival which was started by the Mayor's Office of Cultural Affairs in 2011 to activate the downtown Atlanta area through visual art, performances and cultural events. The Ailey organization also looks forward to realizing additional collaborative initiatives with Dance Canvas; the High Museum of Art; the National Center for Civil and Human Rights, including an annual panel discussion led by Ailey Artistic Director Robert Battle; Spelman College Atlanta; and local artists and scholars, such as author Pearl Cleage.

## **About Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater**

Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, recognized by U.S. Congressional resolution as a vital American "Cultural Ambassador to the World," grew from a now-fabled March 1958 performance in New York that changed forever the perception of American dance. Founded by Alvin Ailey, recent posthumous recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom – the nation's highest civilian honor, and guided by Judith Jamison beginning in 1989, the Company is now led by Robert Battle, whom Judith Jamison chose to succeed her on July 1, 2011. Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater has performed for an estimated 25 million people in 71 countries on 6 continents – as well as millions more through television broadcasts, film screenings, and online platforms - promoting the uniqueness of the African-American cultural experience and the preservation and enrichment of the American modern dance tradition. In addition to being the Principal Dance Company of New York City Center, where its performances have become a year-end tradition, the Ailey company performs annually at Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts, the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, DC, the Auditorium Theatre in Chicago, the Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts of Miami-Dade County in Miami, The Fox Theatre in Atlanta, Zellerbach Hall in Berkeley, CA and at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center in Newark where it is the Principal Resident Affiliate), and appears frequently in other major theaters throughout the United States and the world during extensive yearly tours. The Ailey organization also includes Ailey II (1974), a second performing company of emerging young dancers and innovative choreographers; The Ailey School (1969), one of the most extensive dance training programs in the world; Ailey Arts in Education & Community Programs, which brings dance into the classrooms, communities and lives of people of all ages; and The Ailey Extension (2005), a program offering dance and fitness classes to the general public, which began with the opening of Ailey's permanent home—the largest building dedicated to dance in New York City, the dance capital of the world —named The Joan Weill Center for Dance, at 55th Street at 9th Avenue in New York City.
