AILEY II – THE NEXT GENERATION OF DANCE – SETS OUT ON A WORLD TOUR AS AILEY'S 60TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION BEGINS

NEW COMMISSIONS INCLUDE WORLD PREMIERES BY URI SANDS, BRADLEY SHELVER, AND ARTISTIC DIRECTOR TROY POWELL, PLUS A COMPANY PREMIERE BY ALVIN AILEY AMERICAN DANCE THEATER ARTISTIC DIRECTOR ROBERT BATTLE

(New York) September 13, 2017 – As the "Ailey Ascending" 60th Anniversary celebration gets underway, Ailey II embarks on a 38-city world tour this Saturday, September 15, continuing through May 18 (schedule on page 3). The renowned 12-member ensemble will inspire audiences in nearly two dozen cities across the U.S., including a stop in Atlanta as part of Ailey's Destination Dance initiative, which uses dance as a centerpiece for engagement through partnerships with cultural, civic, and educational institutions. Ailey II will reach international audiences in Canada, Poland, Germany, France, Luxembourg, and Spain, and will return home for its annual New York season, taking place at NYU Skirball Center for the Performing Arts March 13 – 17, 2019.

Ailey II is universally renowned for merging the spirit and energy of the country's best young dance talent with the passion and creative vision of today's most outstanding emerging choreographers. One of the most popular dance companies in the country, Ailey II combines a rigorous touring schedule with extensive community outreach programs. In his seventh year as **Artistic Director**, **Troy Powell** announces four exciting new commissions.

"This is a special year for the Ailey organization," said Powell. "As the second company joins in Ailey's 60th Anniversary celebration, it seems only fitting to bring in works by choreographers from the Ailey family – Uri Sands, Bradley Shelver, Ailey Artistic Director Robert Battle, and myself."

Uri Sands, in collaboration with the dancers of Ailey II, created *Tracks*, a work that braids together ballet, modern, and urban dance techniques. The soundtrack, featuring The O'Jays, Big Louisiana, Arthur Davis, and Willy Rafus, underscores the powerful movement which examines racial, sexual, and economic divisions in our world today.

South African-born Bradley Shelver's high-energy *Where There Are Tongues* is inspired by the idea that we are all in this world together, succeeding or failing as a collective. The rhythmically complex music, by French a cappella group Lo Còr De La Plana, couples with Shelver's quirky style to make dance theater that will set pulses racing.

An early signature work by Robert Battle, *Flock* depicts a community of believers under the control of a charismatic but flawed leader. The percussive score, composed by the Scottish virtuoso Evelyn Glennie, delivers intense emotions that mirror Battle's distinctive, hard-hitting choreography.

Troy Powell's picturesque duet *Ebb and Flow* – set to Samuel Barber's most famous work, "Adagio for Strings" – calls to mind the rush and calm of the ocean tide. This non-narrative work matches the emotional impact of Barber's lyrical music as two beings come together as one.

"I had the pleasure of dancing with Uri Sands in Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater in the '90s, a time during which the Company went on a historic tour to South Africa. While there, then-Artistic Director Judith Jamison handpicked Bradley Shelver from an outreach activity to receive a scholarship to The Ailey School, where he attended before joining Ailey II. Both men have become outstanding choreographers, and I'm proud to welcome them home. I'm also thrilled to bring another breathtaking work by Ailey Artistic Director Robert Battle into the repertory. And of course, after six years, I'm excited to unveil my first world premiere since becoming the Artistic Director of this extraordinary company."

Part of Ailey II's tour will include a stop in Atlanta, where they will perform on Friday, October 19 at 8pm at Providence Missionary Baptist Church as part of the ELEVATE festival, and at The Rialto Center for the Arts on Saturday, October 20 at 8pm. Additionally, on Friday, October 19 at Auburn Avenue Research Library, Ailey and Hammonds House will present "Movement in Focus: Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater on Film," a screening of 2015's Lincoln Center at the Movies film, followed by a Q&A with Troy Powell moderated by WABE 90.1 FM host Rose Scott. All of these events are part of Destination Dance, the Ailey organization's initiative to collaborate with Atlanta's arts and civic organizations through workshops, master classes, performances, special events, and more. Destination Dance activities taking place in advance of Ailey II's performances include an AileyDance for Active Seniors workshop, a weeklong Arts In Education Revelations Residency at two Atlanta public schools, an Ailey Extension Horton workshop, and more. In addition, seven new dancers – <u>Grace Bergonzi</u>, <u>Leonardo Brito</u>, <u>Carl Ponce</u>, <u>Cubero</u>, <u>Caroline Theodora Dartey</u>, <u>Amarachi Valentina Korie</u>, <u>Alisha Rena Peek</u>, and <u>Marcel Wilson</u>, <u>Jr.</u> – join the five returning members – <u>Antuan Byers</u>, <u>Kyle H. Martin</u>, <u>Corrin Rachelle Mitchell</u>, <u>Arianna Salerno</u>, and <u>Marcus Williams</u>. Along with the three world premieres, Ailey II's touring repertory will include <u>Breaking Point</u> by Renee McDonald, <u>Circular</u> by Jae Man Joo, <u>Road To One</u> by Darrell Grand Moultrie, <u>Touch & Agree</u> by Juel D. Lane, <u>Virtues</u> by Amy Hall Garner, and additional works by members of the Ailey family – <u>Gêmeos</u> by Ailey star Jamar Roberts, <u>Stream of Consciousness</u> by former Ailey dancer Marcus Willis, <u>The Hunt</u> and <u>Takademe</u> by Ailey Artistic Director Robert Battle, and <u>Revelations</u> – the must-see masterpiece by Alvin Ailey himself.
