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

NEW YORK – February 4, 2019 — Led by Liberty City native and Artistic Director [Robert Battle](#), Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, one of the world's favorite dance companies, returns to the **Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts of Miami-Dade County February 14-17**, as part of a **21-city U.S. Tour honoring 60 years of *Ailey Ascending***. Miami native [Jamar Roberts](#), along with 32 of Ailey's extraordinary dancers, will reveal the power, passion and astonishing beauty that have become a hallmark of the company. Ailey's Miami engagement is co-presented by the Adrienne Arsht Center as part of the Center's Knight Masterworks Season - Dance Series, which is offered with support from Knight Foundation.

Robert Battle said, "Alvin Ailey was a pioneer in celebrating the human spirit through the African-American culture and modern dance, elevating the world of the performing arts and the hearts and minds of people of all backgrounds. It is a privilege for me to return home to Miami as we honor his storied legacy by heightening the artistry of our performances and extending the reach of our educational programs. We hope you will join us to be uplifted during the "Ailey Ascending" 60th anniversary season at the Arsht!"

The Thursday, February 14 opening night program (also performed Saturday, 2/16 evening) will include acclaimed hip-hop choreographer Rennie Harris' [Lazarus](#), the Company's first two-act ballet. Inspired by Alvin

Ailey's life and legacy, Harris connects the past and present in the powerful work that addresses the racial inequities America faced when Mr. Ailey founded this company in 1958 and still faces today.

The Friday, February 15 evening program (also performed Saturday, 2/17 matinee evening) will feature the world premiere of 2018 Dance Magazine Award winner **Ronald K. Brown's [The Call](#)** seamlessly blends modern and West African dance idioms, as "a love letter to Mr. Ailey." The music includes Johann Sebastian Bach (performed by Chris Thile, Edgar Meyere & Yo-Yo Ma), Mary Lou Williams, and Asase Yaa. A new production will be staged of Artistic Director **Robert Battle's** first work for the Company, **[Juba](#)**, a modern day "Rite of Spring" with an abstract twist set to an original score by John Mackey. **Wayne McGregor's [Kairos](#)**, his second Company premiere (following 2013's *Chroma*) feature Idris Khan's dramatic set design and McGregor's angular yet sinuous movement on a cast of 10. The title has dual meanings – one being the most opportune time to act, the other weather – and is set to Vivaldi's *The Four Seasons*, re-imagined by experimental composer Max Richter.

A Family Matinee on Saturday, February 16 at 2:00 pm, will showcase a special program entitled, "**Timeless Ailey**," featuring over a dozen treasures from Mr. Ailey's wonderfully rich body of work, including highlights of seldom-seen gems *The Lark Ascending*, *Mary Lou's Mass* and *Opus McShann* as well as perennial favorites like *Cry*, *Love Songs*, *Night Creature*, and *Revelations*. The family matinee also includes a **free post-performance Q & A in the theater with Miami natives Robert Battle and Jamar Roberts** for the enjoyment of the entire family.

The inspiring finale of each program is the must-see American masterpiece **[Revelations](#)**. Since its creation in 1960, *Revelations* has inspired generations through its powerful storytelling and soul-stirring spirituals. Springing from Ailey's childhood memories of growing up in the south and attending services at Mount Olive Baptist Church in Texas, *Revelations* pays homage to the rich cultural heritage of the African-American and explores the emotional spectrum of the human condition.

When **Alvin Ailey** and a small group of African American modern dancers first took the stage at the 92nd Street Y in 1958, the engagement was for one night only—but it turned out to be the start of a new era in the performing arts. Mr. Ailey became one of the groundbreaking greats in African American history, while the work of his Company grew beyond the limits of the stage to encompass education at all levels, community outreach and cultural diplomacy. Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater now embodies six decades of achievement, celebrating the human spirit with performances that unite and inspire all.

Educational Offerings for the Miami Community

The Arsht Center and Ailey will provide various arts education offerings and training opportunities for young people in conjunction with the Company's Miami engagement.

In addition to **[Revelations: An Interdisciplinary Approach residency](#)** taking place at **Richmond Heights Middle School**, ***Night Creature: An Imaginative Journey Through Dance* residency** will be conducted at **Dr. Henry E. Perrine Elementary Academy of the Arts** from **February 4-8**. This innovative curriculum-based initiative uses Mr. Ailey's *Night Creature*, set to a sparkling score by jazz legend Duke Ellington, as a framework for young students to explore the power of their imaginations through writing poetry, drawing, and creating their own choreography.

On **Friday, February 15 at 11:00 am**, a special one-hour performance featuring *Night Creature* and *Revelations* will be offered by the Arsht Center and Ailey **at no cost to approximately 2,000 public school students in the Miami-Dade County area**, including the Liberty City neighborhood where Robert Battle grew up.

On **Saturday, February 16 at 2:00 pm**, alumni from **AileyCamp Miami** have been invited to attend the Family Matinee performance and participate in a reunion pre-performance. **AileyCamp Miami** is a nationally-acclaimed summer program hosted by the Arsht Center since 2009 that uses dance as a vehicle to help middle school students ages 11-14 to reach their full potential.

60 years after its founding, Ailey continues to move forward under the leadership of Robert Battle, revealing time and again why Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater is one of the world's most beloved dance companies. Acclaimed hip-hop choreographer Rennie (Lorenzo) Harris returns to Ailey this season with the Company’s first two-act work, *Lazarus*. Inspired by the life and legacy of Mr. Ailey, Harris connects past and present in a powerful work that addresses the racial inequities America faced when Mr. Ailey founded this company in 1958 and still faces today. Harris’ previous contributions to the Ailey repertory include *Exodus* (2015), *Home* (2011), and *Love Stories* (2004), Judith Jamison’s dynamic collaboration with Rennie Harris and Robert Battle.

2018 Dance Magazine Award recipient Ronald K. Brown’s joyous mix of modern and West African dance idioms – seen previously in *Grace* (1999), *Open Door* (2015), *Four Corners* (2013), and other works – fits the Ailey dancers perfectly, and his themes of spiritual awakening and redemption never fail to inspire. *The Call*, which is Brown’s seventh work for the Company, is “a love letter to Mr. Ailey,” set to the music of Johann Sebastian Bach (performed by Chris Thile, Edgar Meyere & Yo-Yo Ma), Mary Lou Williams, and Asase Yaa.

[Kairos](#) (2014 / Company Premiere 2018)

Kairos, choreographer Wayne McGregor’s second Ailey Company premiere, fills the stage with sinuous, angular movement and synchronicity. Drawn from the ancient Greek language, the word “Kairos” has dual meanings, the first being the most opportune time to take action and the second being weather. The ballet is framed by Idris Khan’s dramatic set design and played out to Vivaldi’s *The Four Seasons*, re-imagined by experimental composer Max Richter. Ailey is the first American company to perform *Kairos*, which originally premiered in 2014 as part of the STEPS contemporary dance festival in Switzerland.

Juba, Artistic Director Robert Battle’s first work for the Company, explores where ritual and folk traditions exist in today’s society, as four dancers engage in a modern day “Rite of Spring” with an abstract twist. More than just a popular dance work, *Revelations* has become a cultural treasure, beloved by generations of fans and acclaimed as a must-see for all. **Alvin Ailey's** signature masterpiece is a tribute to his heritage. Using African-American spirituals, the work fervently explores the places of deepest grief and holiest joy in the soul. Seeing *Revelations* for the first time or the hundredth can be a transcendent experience. Audiences cheer, sing along, and dance in their seats from the opening notes of the plaintive "I Been 'Buked" to the rousing "Wade in the Water" and the triumphant finale, "Rocka My Soul in the Bosom of Abraham."

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About Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater

Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, recognized by U.S. Congressional resolution as a vital American "Cultural Ambassador to the World," grew from a now-fabled March 1958 performance in New York that changed forever the perception of American dance. Founded by Alvin Ailey, recent posthumous recipient of the Presidential Medal of Freedom – the nation's highest civilian honor – and guided by Judith Jamison beginning in 1989, the Company is now led by Robert Battle, whom Judith Jamison chose to succeed her on July 1, 2011. Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater has performed for an estimated 25 million people in 71 countries on 6 continents – as well as millions more through television broadcasts, film screenings, and online platforms - promoting the uniqueness of the African-American cultural experience and the preservation and enrichment of the American modern dance tradition. In addition to being the Principal Dance Company of New York City Center, where its performances have become a year-end tradition, the Ailey company performs annually at Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts, the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, DC, the Auditorium Theatre in Chicago, the Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts of Miami-Dade County in Miami, The Fox Theatre in Atlanta, Zellerbach Hall in Berkeley, CA, and at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center in Newark where it is the Principal Resident Affiliate), and appears frequently in other major theaters throughout the United States and the world during extensive yearly tours. The Ailey organization also includes Ailey II (1974), a second performing company of emerging young dancers and innovative choreographers; The Ailey School (1969), one of the most extensive dance training programs in the world; Ailey Arts in Education & Community Programs, which brings dance into the classrooms, communities, and lives of people of all ages; and Ailey Extension (2005), a program offering dance and fitness classes to the general public, which began with the opening of Ailey's permanent home—the largest building dedicated to dance in New York City, the dance capital of the world —named The Joan Weill Center for Dance, at 55th Street at 9th Avenue in New York City.
