# ALVIN AILEY AMERICAN DANCE THEATER RETURNS TO LINCOLN CENTER'S DAVID H. KOCH THEATER AFTER MORE THAN A DECADE FOR A SEVEN-PERFORMANCE ENGAGEMENT FROM JUNE 12 TO 16, 2013

Artistic Director Robert Battle Announces a Diverse Repertory Highlighted by the World Premiere of *Four Corners* by Celebrated Dance Maker Ronald K. Brown Plus Encore Performances of 2012 – 2013 Season Premieres and Repertory Favorites

Tickets starting at \$25 go on sale April 1, 2013.

New York - March 26, 2013 – Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, beloved as one of the world's most popular dance companies, returns to Lincoln Center for the Performing Arts for the first time in 13 years for a seven-performance engagement at the David H. Koch Theater June 12-16, 2013. Today, Artistic Director Robert Battle announced repertory for the season anchored with a world premiere by celebrated choreographer Ronald K. Brown, along with encore performances of 2012-2013 season premieres and repertory favorites, including Alvin Ailey's acclaimed American masterpiece Revelations.

"I'm proud to lead Ailey's extraordinary dancers back to a renowned Lincoln Center stage after over a decade – it's a special milestone for me and the Company," said Artistic Director Robert Battle. "I'm also thrilled to announce the repertory, which will feature an inspiring new work from choreographer Ronald K. Brown, as well as the great choreographic voices of Alvin Ailey, Garth Fagan, Jiří Kylián, and Ohad Naharin."

Ronald K. Brown's newest work, *Four Corners*, is being created especially for the Company's Koch Theater engagement and premieres on opening night. Set to the music of **Carl Hancock Rux**, **Yacoub**, and various artists, it brings to life the vision of four angels standing on the four corners of the earth holding the four winds. Drawing inspiration from the lyrics of Rux's "Lamentations," *Four Corners* trails eleven dancers on a powerful, challenging and hope-filled journey to seek a life of peace on the "mountaintop."

The opening program (also scheduled for Friday evening, Saturday matinee, and Sunday evening), includes an encore performance of <u>Petite Mort</u> - a ballet of visual surprises that showcases the sensuality, humor and virtuosity of Ailey's dancers by renowned European choreographer **Jiří Kylián**. Danced to two of **Mozart's** most popular piano concertos, it blends a classical sensibility with a bold, modern wit in an unforgettable duel of the sexes featuring six couples.

The alternate program on Thursday evening (repeating on Saturday evening and Sunday matinee) features Garth Fagan's *From Before*, Ronald K. Brown's *Grace*, and Robert Battle's *Takademe*. Ailey's December premiere of *From Before*, a revered work blending the rhythms of African dance with Caribbean influences to a score by Grammy winner **Ralph MacDonald**, is the only staging for a company other than Garth Fagan Dance. **Grace**, which returned to the repertory this season, is infused with Brown's signature blend of modern dance and West African idioms and set to **Duke Ellington's** classic "Come Sunday," **Roy Davis'** hit "Gabriel," and the powerful rhythms of **Fela Kuti's** Afro-Pop. *Takademe* contains the complex, tightly woven rhythms of Indian Kathak dance in a percussive, fast-paced, propulsive work mimicking the vocalized rhythmic syllables of **Sheila Chandra's** jazzy song.

All programs, except for Saturday evening, will end with the inspiring <u>Revelations</u>, an American classic acclaimed as a must-see for all. Alvin Ailey's signature piece is a tribute to his heritage and a testament to his genius. Using African-American religious music – spirituals – this suite fervently explores the places of deepest grief and holiest joy in the soul.

Saturday evening's program will conclude with **Ohad Naharin's phenomenally inventive** <u>Minus</u> <u>16</u>, danced to an eclectic score ranging from Dean Martin to mambo, techno to traditional Israeli music. Using Naharin's acclaimed "Gaga" method to overcome old habits and make room for new movement and new experiences, this expansive ensemble work is unlike any other in the Ailey repertory in the way it challenges the dancers to improvise and breaks down barriers between audience and performers.

#### The 2013 Lincoln Center Engagement: Highlights

Artistic Director Robert Battle and Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater will present a seven-performance engagement at Lincoln Center's David H. Koch Theater from June 12<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup>, 2013. Ailey's acclaimed dancers will perform a diverse repertory featuring *Four Corners*, a world premiere by the celebrated dance maker Ronald K. Brown, along with encores of this season's premieres and repertory favorites, including Alvin Ailey's American masterpiece *Revelations*.

#### **World Premiere**

Four Corners (2013) choreographed by Ronald K Brown Music: Carl Hancock Rux, Yacoub & Various Artists Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater returns to Lincoln Center after more than a decade with a world premiere by celebrated choreographer Ronald K. Brown. Four Corners, set to the music of Carl Hancock Rux, along with various artists, brings to life the vision of four angels standing on the four corners of the earth holding the four winds. Drawing inspiration from the lyrics of Rux's "Lamentations," Four Corners trails eleven dancers as they rise to seek a life of peace on the "mountaintop;" a powerful and hope-filled journey of tribulation, devotion and triumph.

Ronald K. Brown is renowned for his signature blend of modern dance and West African idioms in works that often stimulate deeper examinations of issues of spirituality, community responsibility and liberation. This is Brown's first collaboration with the critically-acclaimed Carl Hancock Rux, but his fifth work set on Ailey's extraordinary dancers, who have become known as inspiring interpreters of his unique dance storytelling.

#### 2012-13 Season Premieres and New Productions

#### Petite Mort (1991) choreographed by Jiří Kylián

Last year marked the company premiere of *Petite Mort*, a ballet of visual surprises that showcases the sensuality, humor and technical prowess of Ailey's dancers, marking the first time a work by renowned European choreographer **Jiří Kylián** appeared in the Ailey repertory. Set to two of **Mozart's** most popular piano concertos (Piano Concerto in A Major – Adagio, and Piano Concerto in C Major – Andante), it blends a classical sensibility with a bold, modern wit in an unforgettable duel featuring six couples. Born in Czechoslovakia in 1947, Kylián was a long-time Artistic Director of Nederlands Dans Theater has become recognized as one of the most influential choreographers of the past three decades, receiving many international awards and honors.

#### From Before (1978) choreographed by Garth Fagan

From Before beautifully blends the rhythms of African dance and Caribbean influences, with movements distilled to their purest form by Jamaican-born **Garth Fagan**, the Tony Award-winning choreographer of *The Lion King*. The Ailey company premiere was the first staging of this revered work, which features a jazzy percussive score by Grammy winner **Ralph MacDonald**, for a company other than Garth Fagan Dance. Mr. Fagan attributed its popularity with audiences all across the world to "the fluidity of Caribbean dance, the polyrhythms of African, the precision of ballet and the strength and weight of modern dance." His many honors include the prestigious 1998 Tony Award for Best Choreography for *The Lion King*, as well as an Astaire Award, and a Laurence Olivier Award, and he holds an honorary doctorate from the Juilliard School. Fagan recently collaborated with Grammy-winning musician and composer Wynton Marsalis on the world premiere of his newest work, *Lighthouse/Lightning Rod* at Brooklyn Academy of Music (BAM) in celebration of BAM's 150th anniversary and Garth Fagan Dance's 40th anniversary.

Ronald K. Brown's landmark and rapturous *Grace*, created for Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater in 1999, returned to the repertory in 2012. Infused with Brown's signature blend of modern dance and West African idioms, this moving journey acknowledging the grace that surrounds us all is set to **Duke Ellington's** classic "Come Sunday," Roy Davis' hit "Gabriel," and the powerful rhythms of Fela Kuti's Afro-Pop. Born in Brooklyn, Brown has created and presented dances since 1985 with his company Evidence and has received the Bessie Award, a Guggenheim Fellowship, and the American Dance Festival Humphrey/Weidman/Limon Award, among others. Most recently he received accolades for his Astaire award-winning choreography for the Broadway revival of *The Gershwin's Porgy and Bess*.

#### **ABOUT ALVIN AILEY AMERICAN DANCE THEATER**

Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, recognized by U.S. Congressional resolution as a vital American "Cultural Ambassador to the World," grew from a now-fabled March 1958 performance in New York that forever changed the perception of American dance. Founded by Alvin Ailey, and guided by Judith Jamison beginning in 1989, the Company is now led by Robert Battle, whom Judith Jamison chose to succeed her on July 1, 2011. Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater has performed for an estimated 23 million people in 71 countries on 6 continents, promoting the uniqueness of the African-American cultural experience and the preservation and enrichment of the American modern dance tradition. In addition to being the Principal Dance Company of New York City Center, where its performances have become a year-end tradition, the Ailey company performs annually at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in Washington, DC, the Auditorium Theatre in Chicago, the Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts of Miami-Dade County in Miami, The Fox Theatre in Atlanta, Zellerbach Hall in Berkeley, CA and at the New Jersey Performing Arts Center in Newark where it is the Principal Resident Affiliate), and appears frequently in other major theaters throughout the United States and the world during extensive yearly tours. The Ailey organization also includes Ailey II (1974), a second performing company of emerging young dancers and innovative choreographers; The Ailey School (1969), one of the most extensive dance training programs in the world; Ailey Arts in Education & Community Programs, which brings dance into the classrooms, communities and lives of people of all ages; and The Ailey Extension (2005), a program offering dance and fitness classes to the general public, which coincided with the opening of Ailey's permanent home—the largest building dedicated to dance in New York City, the dance capital of the world —named The Joan Weill Center for Dance, at 55th Street at 9th Avenue in New York City.
